1) What attributes of God do you see displayed in Revelation 15 and 16? What other attributes of God are highlighted throughout Revelation?

2) Read Exodus 15:1-8. What parallels do you see between that text and Revelation 15:2-4?

3) Why will no one be able to accuse God of being unfair when they receive His judgment?

4) What are some wrong views of God? What are some wrong views of man?

5) Why do you think people fail to repent even after experiencing God's judgement?

6) Why is there so much worship going on in the midst of such wrath being poured out upon the earth?

7) What should we make of Revelation 16:15? What does it mean to stay alert and remained clothed as we wait for Christ's return?

8) Have you accepted the fact that apart from God's grace, you are infinitely deserving of God's eternal wrath? Why is it important to remember that fact daily? How does realizing that reality change the way you value Christ and share the gospel?

9) Should God's wrath motivate holiness in our lives, not because we fear His wrath, but because we feel his hatred of sin? In what specific ways should we allow God's wrath to motivate us? In other words, because God's just wrath is real, what does God want us to do?

10) What questions do you still have regarding Revelation 15-16? What are some applications for us from Revelation 15 & 16?
